ove is a wonderful thing - the feeling that someone in this world thinks that you are the best, most special person that has ever been. We've all hopefully known what it is to be loved - because love is all around - husbands and wives, boyfriends and girlfriends, fathers and sons, mothers and daughters, just friends - love is everywhere and will always be because everyone loves to be loved. So much of the love we hear of today is mushy love, and sometimes you can get too much of a good thing, but the love we hear of in today's Gospel is pure love - the love we're all asked to show to God, neighbour and ourselves. I often think the love of God might have a slight boredom to it, because it's not that terribly exciting, but it is a love that should make us all feel truly special if we take to think about what it really is.

The love of God is simply 'perfect acceptance' – our acceptance of the hand of God in our lives no matter what, God's acceptance of us no matter what we do, how we mess up or fall short, and then our acceptance of others with all their faults and failings and yet still seeing them as special. But of course none of it is possible unless we love ourselves first. Loving yourself doesn't mean idling the day away looking in a mirror and saying 'how wonderful am I', it means accepting yourself as you are, not living your life trying to be someone else or be bigger or better than everyone else, but just being happy with yourself as you are. Not being ashamed that you can't do everything and not being a pain because you can do something. Only when we accept that we're not perfect but that we're still special can we start to do the same to everyone else. When we accept that we won't do everything right ourselves we can accept that sometimes God doesn't or won't give us what we want or think we need, but that He still thinks we're His perfect creation. When we admit our own imperfections we can accept them more easily in other people and then pure love or perfect acceptance becomes second nature to us. But today's world doesn't encourage that so much - instead it sets an ideal before us - look a certain way, think a certain way, act a certain way and you will be fabulous. I suspect God knows a bit more about these things than the modern world does, and if you do one thing against modern culture let it be this - throw away all notions of changing yourself to fit in with what is perfect today. Just be yourself (warts and all), accept yourself (weaknesses and all), love yourself (strengths and all) and give everyone the same chance you give yourself. When you do you'll find it's not really that hard to love God at all.
