he feast of Corpus Christi was declared a universal feast of the Church in 1264 to celebrate the beauty of the Blessed Sacrament as one of God's ongoing gifts to the world. It is a very special thing to receive the Body of Christ. Everyone makes a great fuss of the First Holy Communion and despite its sadness no one wants to miss or deprive their loved ones of the last Holy Communion, but this feast celebrates the equal importance of all the in between Holy Communions. In the Eucharist we become one with God for a little time, we eat His Body and all the goodness, love and kindness of God becomes part of us and but that we are human we'd become ever more like God in our mind and our ways. I suppose the only way we can let that happen is by looking again at the way we approach Holy Communion – not as a right or box to be ticked, not as just joining in with everyone else or not just like gathering tokens and numbers, but with real respect and worship – believing that this is really God, knowing that this is a special grace and blessing to be honoured and adored.

Apollo 11 landed on the moon on Sunday, July 20, 1969. Most remember astronaut Neil Armstrong's first words as he stepped onto the moon's surface: "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." But few know about the first Fr O'Neill

meal eaten on the moon. Dennis Fisher reports that Buzz Aldrin, the NASA Astronaut had taken aboard the spacecraft a tiny pyx provided by his priest, Fr Dennis Barry. Aldrin sent a radio broadcast to Earth asking listeners to contemplate the events of the day and give thanks. Then, blacking out the broadcast for privacy, Aldrin read, "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit." Then, silently, he gave thanks for their successful journey to the moon and received Jesus in the Holy Eucharist surrendering the moon to Jesus. Next, he descended on the moon and walked on it with Neil Armstrong. In the midst of the greatest moment of the Century, he took time to bow before his God, to receive the Blessed Sacrament with respect, giving God glory and dignity. When we do the same God fills us with the grace to be His true servants on this world. Always remember the special gift that the Eucharist is, always encourage honour and worship. In every Mass something special happens, God is suddenly there and we kneel before him. Let that worship shape our lives and every day, no matter how great or ordinary it is, give God the honour and place he deserves and show others to do the same.
