ver the next few weeks we'll hear a whole series of stories of Christ calling his disciples, who if truth be told, weren't really that wonderful a bunch. You had a dodgy tax man, a thief, a few fishermen and some we know nothing about. If you wanted to set up a new movement they wouldn't exactly be the first choice, but yet they were the ones Christ called - the weak, the ordinary, the humans, and out of them came everything we have today in terms of our faith. Christ recognised them for what they were - men with potential, with a good heart and despite the appearances they were the ones he wanted. Today and the next few Sundays is really about people recognising Christ in the world and Christ recognising the good in all His people. It's said that we only recognise in people what we see in ourselves. That we see people not as they are but as we are. There's a story told about a King who called one of his servants to him. The servant was known to be a cruel, mean man, who had no friends. The King said to him, 'I want you to go and travel the length and breadth of my kingdom and find for me a truly good person.' The man went, and as he travelled around, he met an awful lot of people. But after a long time he came back to the King and said, 'I have searched the whole kingdom as you asked me to, but I couldn't find even one truly good person. Every one of them is either mean, cruel, deceitful or evil. The good person you're looking for just isn't to be found. So the

King called another servant. This one was known for his generosity and kindness, and was loved by everyone. The King said to him, 'Go and travel the length and breadth of my kingdom, and find for me a truly wicked person? The man went and travelled far and wide. But after a long time, he returned to the King saying, 'I have failed in the task you gave me to do. I found people who are misguided, people who are misled, and people who act rashly, on the spur of the moment without thinking, but no-one who is a truly evil person. All of them are good at heart, despite all the bad things they may have done.' We see in others what is in ourselves. Sometimes it's easy to get carried away thinking we live in an awful world, filled with the bad, the careless, the brutes, but when you stop and think there's really an awful lot of good there too - an awful lot of decent, kind, helpful people. And in every one of them is the little bit of God that was first spotted in today's Gospel, and that Christ saw in the first 12. And when we encourage the good and look for it, suddenly God is everywhere in the world. John saw the God in Christ and look what happened, Christ saw the good in the disciples and look what happened with a little encouragement. Look for the good around you and in you too, and with a pat on the back, a gentle prod you never what it can do.
