day's Gospel throws the cat among the pigeons for a lot of us when Jesus challenges us to try to treat people a different and a better way, by giving us 4 different ways to become holy - by not seeking revenge, by trying to love the one that hurts us, by trying to forgive others and by praying for those who hurt us. In so many ways it seems like an awful hard ask for any of us because, being human, we all have a great ease to take offence, a great comfort in being hurt and a secret satisfaction in getting our own back. But what does any of it achieve? When we think about all the best things that have ever happened in the world, not one of them was built on or born out of hatred. When we think about all the terrible horrors that have ravaged the world, not one of them was born out of love. Good breeds good and bad breeds bad. We mightn't think that our little offences and revenges really matter but they do, because they effect real people, and nearly always those people are the same ones we have to look at and meet every day and every week, and the bad will we let grow turns into an awkward scar that makes life difficult for us as much as them. In the world today, you might be classed a bit of a clown for being too nice, too decent, too soft - but if that's the worst that anyone can say about you, it's an easy criticism to live with. When Christ says forgive your ene-

mies, turn the other cheek, pray for those you hate, love your fellow man, He knows your only human and He knows how hard it can be. What He really asks is that you try to be brave, try to have courage when the world might seem to be against you - sometimes we all have to be willing to take a blow or a hit in life and not have to get our own back. When we let anger and hate build up in us we start to drip feed a little poison into our hearts and our souls and over time we turn into miserable, angry and grumpy people – people who aren't happy and who struggle to find or see happiness. So often, we're not even aware that it's happening to us. When we forgive good things happen. Nelson Mandela was locked up for 28 years and after that time he could have walked out of jail an angry and bitter man, looking for revenge, but he didn't. In prison he made the decision to respect those he met and that made all the difference. Because he suffered and because he forgave he gained a moral authority that helped him lead his country peacefully to a new future rather than into a bloodbath of hate. Loving your enemy worked for him and it can work for us too. Maybe Lent is the time to give up hate and start to live happily again.
