COVID-19 NEW NORMS REGARDING WORSHIP

The Public celebration of Mass is suspended until further notice. Mass will be broadcast at the normal times on the Parish Website. Thank you for adhering to the guidelines and for joining us for Mass via the webcam service.

In line with Diocesan Stipulations and with Government advice <u>all weddings and baptisms</u> <u>are currently suspended</u>. In the case of an emergency please contact the Parish Office.

Funerals are a sad reality, and will continue as normal in the Parish. However we're all asked to respect the advice of experts and limit attendance strictly to family only, and to maintain distancing regulations throughout.

Due to the impossibility of respecting the confidentiality of Confession while still maintaining sensible distancing requirements, at the decision of the Diocese, <u>Confessions are currently suspended.</u>

This is a particularly difficult time for all those who are sick at home and also for their families as they possibly cannot be with them as much as they would like. So too it is very difficult to have to not call with the sick to bring them Holy Communion or to administer the Anointing of the Sick. However, if someone is seriously ill please do call on your Priests to administer the Last Rites in an attempt of bring them comfort at the end and the grace of God to strengthen them in their last days.

All anniversaries will be offered on the appropriate day and you are invited to join together as a family and spend a few moments in prayer on that day to remember your loved ones.

Sadly the Stormont Executive has ruled that all Churches remain closed throughout the day as a safety precaution to avoid social contact. In line with this ruling the Churches of our Parish will unfortunately remain closed for the present. We can only hope that this is a short term measure so that people will once more have the opportunity of private prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.
