

doday we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the feast of the Holy Spirit, which commemorates the moment He descended on the Apostles in the upper room and gave them all they needed to go out into the world and teach that world the great message of Christ - the great message of love to above and to all around us. In the Jewish faith the Feast was known as Shavuot – a day to give thanks for the first fruits of the wheat harvest, and for the Christians the theme carried on, but their first fruits were a much better gift, the same gifts we all receive from the same Holy Ghost. At confirmation we all received 7 gifts – wisdom, understanding, right judgement, courage, knowledge, reverence and wonder and awe in God's presence. At different times of our lives the different gifts come into their own. Sometimes it would be great to be wise, at other times it would be wise to have proper judgement and know when to act or speak and when not to. Reverence is always admirable and wonder and awe helps us see the greatness of God in everyone and everything. But I often think the best gift of the lot is courage – the courage to do what is the right thing even if it's hard, the courage to stand up for what is right, to defend those who need it, to be the friend to the lonely reject, to not be bullied out of our opinions or beliefs, to not bend with the wind but rather stand firm and true for what is right, honest, decent and holy. When he got the gift of courage the greatest man of the lot was St Peter, and yet a few weeks ago we heard of him terrified when asked did he even know Christ. But just think what he went on to do – become the first leader of the Church and willing to give his life for his faith and his God. Whenever you find it difficult to follow the right path in life, he's a good example to follow because he shows that we all have just enough strength from God to do what we need to and ought to. In your life, never be afraid to do the right thing regardless of what others think. Never be afraid to use those other gifts you have for good. There'll be not a thanks or a recognition maybe, but who cares – if your greatest mistake is to be too decent, too kind, too generous, too helpful, and too good to people, or even to be too holy in your ways – it'd be a great mistake to be known for. But it takes courage to do it. you've been given that courage already through your faith – use it well, use it often and always use it just that little bit too much
