here's little more annoying than the person who thinks they're just that little bit better than everyone else and who thinks they're entitled to just a little bit more than everyone else - more respect, more money, a better seat at everything, a bigger hello than everyone else and even a bit more from God. Behind the big false self belief, we're all very equal in this world - we'll all worry just the same, we'll feel pain and hurt just the same, we'll all be sick the same and we'll all laugh, love and smile just the same too, and when we come to our end, we'll all sit in the same spot in Church as the same funeral prayers are prayed over us. When the flaff and fluff of life is taken away, we're all equal because we're all made by the same God and all born with the same dignity and it's only the things of the world that make us different. Today's Gospel reminds us of that, that despite what the world might say, God has no favourites and God treats all believers the same - the rigidly devout and the stumbling trier are all the one in God's eyes because they all believe, all worship to the best of their ability. In a world filled with so many big movements all aimed at the latest equality of the age there's a growing danger that the fight for one equality actually causes another inequality somewhere else in the human chain. Of course the mouthpiece will always shout, the miltiant will always stomp his way through, but oddly the quiet soul who just tries to genuinely treat all people as equals rather than special equals for some, is ignored or left behind in the rush of action. Based on today's Gospel we're encouraged to think about how we can build a genuinely equal world that mirrors the kingdom of heaven in our own age. Equality is all about respect for others in every part of life, and only when we begin to respect each other with all our faults and failings as well as our talents and gifts, will equality start to grow in the world. It's only when greed or snobbishness, lust or an inflated sense of our own importance comes in that equality goes out the window. And those are never the things of God. When Christ came to earth He didn't come to save a lucky few, He came to save everyone, and whether we're strong or weak in life, big or small in the world, if we treat others in the ways of God - fairly, with respect, with tolerance, with graciousness and with love, then God will treat us that way too. Every day is a chance to think about our actions and the huge impact they have on others, unbeknownst to ourselves. Maybe now is the time to really think about what we do ourselves and think a little less about what others do and don't do. In a world that needs to improve very quickly, where do you fit in? What do you really want your world to be like and what do you (not others) have to do to make that world happen? In the great level of Christ we're all judged on our own lives and on our own commitment based on our particular abilities - now is the time to stop and measure your life as Christ does and use that life for the world not just for you.

COVID RESURGENCE: We're all sadly aware that Covid 19 appears to making a startling resurgence throughout the country, and in an effort to maintain the safety of everyone in Church, I sincerely ask you to follow all the guidelines set in place. Please book your slot for Mass as this enables us to keep a record, for a safe period only, of all attendees in the case of local infection. You can book Online or in the Church well in advance. Please enter only by the Main Church doors and sanitise well. Please maintain a safe social distance at all times, even in the procession for Holy Communion, to ensure safety and comfort for all. I know this is a continuing nuisance to us all, but these guidelines are only there to ensure that everyone feels safe in the Church for services. The Church is disinfected daily to maintain our highest level possible of hygiene. Many thanks to all for their patience and co-operation.

FACE MASKS: Please remember to wear your face mask at all times when participating in Church Services. I'm sure we're all agreed they can be uncomfortable things at times but it is a requirement of Law at the moment that face coverings must be used in all social settings, and is required only to ensure the safety of both yourself and others as the pandemic makes a resurgence.
