here really are an awful lot of good people in the world when we stop and have a look around us, and more times than not they don't think they're doing anything special – that all they're doing is their job. The teacher who just goes that little bit above and beyond to make sure her children are happy and worry free; the doctor or nurse who just takes the little bit of time to chat beyond the sickness and give someone the time they need; the parent who gives up a bit of their own time and comfort to make sure their child gets that extra little something they've been dreaming of; the neighbour who remembers you in the shop; the parishioner who says that wee prayer to help you along; the person who smiles at the right time. So many good people all around us, and if they weren't there things would be very glum. They probably don't think they're doing anything marvellous, but every one of them is the face of God in life and every one of them is the love of God at work in the world. Today's Gospel reminds us of the greatest commandment - to love God, to love our neighbour and to love ourselves as well. Like all things, if we overthink it all we'll spend that much time trying to be super holy, super kind and super confident that we'll lose the whole point – love is about doing the tiny little things that just put others first – love of God can be shown by one prayer that comes from the heart, love of neighbour can be shown by always thinking of and doing that tiny little thing that no one else remembers or thinks is that important, loving ourselves is simply accepting we're not perfect, not brilliant at everything but that we're still trying our very best. It takes so little to love and yet the difference it makes is huge. Today is our day to think about love in our lives - where it is and where we show it. It's really a day to remember that we're all good people or at least can all be good people. If you're not sure how or where you could do it – just stop for a minute and look all around you. There are so many good people out there doing the important things every day that make people feel special and give them a little respect and dignity, our inspiration is everywhere really. To be a Christian is so simple – it just means always showing everyone and everything a bit of love. Who cares if the world doesn't bother, if we try to do it here then all our lives will be a lot happier and better because the love of God isn't written on a page any more but is part and parcel of our day.

### **Covid Guidelines For Church Attendance:**

- 1: Please book your seat in advance to ensure safe capacity numbers
- 2: Sanitise your hands as you enter the Main doors
- 3: Maintain Social Distancing while seated and follow the guidance of our stewards.
- 4: Wear a face mask at all times
- 5: Leave space while coming up to receive Holy Communion and please return to your seat by the side aisles to maintain the safe distance.
- 6: Leave by the side doors but give others space at the exit points.

**<u>FACE MASKS</u>**: In line with the latest Government Guidelines, face masks are now compulsory when entering and leaving the Church and must be worn throughout Services. Many thanks for your further co-operation in this regulation.

**BOOKING ESSENTIAL:** With the latest guidelines tightening it's imprtant that you book your place for Mass in advance and leave a contact number to maintain a track and trace system to ensure the safety and comfort of all, and to ensure only a safe number are in attendance. Booking can be made in the Church or online via the Parish website. Thank you for all your patience as we slowly make our way through the current mess.

**FUNERAL RESTRICTIONS:** On Wednesday 14th October Stormont issued new guidelines regarding funeral attendance, with a maximum number of attendees being set at 25. This is a governemnt policy applied equally to all Churches and sadly we have no individual discretion in regard to these limits. On the morning of a funeral I would ask you to leave the Church free for mourners, to give families every chance to be present at this sad time. Thank you for your further patience and kindness to others.

OCTOBER DEVOTIONS: conclude this Sunday in the Church of the Holy Family at <u>6.00pm</u>. Our prayers will be offered especially for the sick of our Parish and for all our parishioners.

**ANNUAL REMEMBRANCE MASS** - will be celebrated on **Friday 6th November at 7.30pm** (*provisional date subject to change under government regulations*) in the Holy family Church. The Mass remembers all those who have died since 1st November 2019 in our Parish and concludes the annual Novena of Masses offered for all those on the Parish Dead List. A Remembrance Board will be erected in the Church containing the names of all who have died in the past year and families are invited to place a Memoriam Card for their loved ones on the board as we keep them all in our prayers.

**HOLY FAMILY CHURCH** will be closed from Monday 9th November until Saturday 14th November to allow for work to the Sanctuary area and the first phase of recarpeting to take place. All Masses and Services that week will be celebrated in St Mary & St Joseph's Church, Brackaville at the normal times.

**CHRISTMAS MASS BOUQUETS:** will be available from the Sacristy from 1st November onwards. All Masses for Christmas Day will be offered for the intentions of those whom you request your Bouquet for. The Mass Offerings for this will be given to the Sick and Retired Priests Fund of the Diocese. 5 design options are available for Mass Bouquets so please feel free to make enquiry in the Sacristy at any time.
