doday we begin the great season of Advent, our annual time of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus at Christmas, the birth of perfect ■ love, of endless hope and of unblemished goodness in the world. Christmas is a very special time for most of us, and while this Christmas may be a bit low key compared to others we have had, at it's heart it is still a time when we're invited to let the best in us rise to the top - a time when we care a little more, smile a little easier, help and love a lot more. All the expected things of Christmas like the dinner, the gifts, the gatherings are all expressions of the happiness that the birth of Christ should bring to our souls and our selves. Of course we're always invited in Advent to give some time to spritual preparation, so that the real meaning of Christmas won't be lost on us. PROVISIONAL CHRISTMAS MASS SCHEDULE

St Mary's Church - Stewartstown - Christmas Vigil - 7.00pm Christmas Day - 10.30am

Holy Family Church - Coalisland - Christmas Vigil - 8.00pm Christmas Dawn - 7.30pm Christmas Day - 11.00am

Attendance at all Masses will be by <u>TICKET ONLY</u>, (available after Masses from Friday 11th December subject to Church reopening) with <u>EACH PERSON ATTENDING</u> needing to have their ticket on entry. No one wants to have to be in a position of turning someone away on Christmas night but we are still limited by Government regulations over which we have no individual discretion. With families in attendance the maximum number for Stewartstown can be increased to 90 and the maximum number in Coalisland to 200. If numbers necessitate it may be possible to celebrate a second Vigil Mass in Coalisland. All Masses will be live streamed for those who wish to be cautious and careful, and the obligation to attend is fulfilled through online participation this year. This is all uncharted territory for everyone and I thank you in advance for your understanding. This is a provisional plan and is subject to change depending on the latest Government advice and regulations.

Anniversaries: even though public worship with a congregation may be impossible at the moment, all anniversaires will be offered on the day requested and Masses can be Participated in online. If anyone has an anniversary booked whihe they would like to chage to a different time, this is easily accommodated.

CONFIRMATION 2021: will be celebrated in smaller class groups next year. The **provisional dates** are as follows: Primate Dixon PS: 20th, 21st & 22nd April; St Mary's PS - 23rd April.
