Parish Bulletin | Third Sunday in Ordinary Time | 24th January 2021

This week in our Gospel Christ continues to call his disciples, and the unlikely fishermen called today left their nets behind and followed him - really they left behind the old ways and went off to see what this new man and new way was all about and see how they could join in. Last week we were reminded that we're all asked to be disciples in the world today - to repent and believe the Good News. We all know the repent side of things - cast off the old ways and try to change into something better, but often the believe bit can be the harder ask - to genuinely actually trust God, to really believe that He's there to guide us and help us make the most of life. With so many presumed quick fixes to life's problems the slow pace of God can sometimes leave us wondering, but to believe is simply to take Jesus at His word - to try our best to forgive, to change, to love, to help, to care and to be the face of God every day. we won't always get it right and we will always make mistakes, but that is part of being a disciple. A disciple is a 'learning follower' someone who just keeps on trusting and trying, and when we all try our best to do what God has asked us the difference can be huge and we can all do our little bit to renew the Church, to renew our communities and our world and make it a slightly happier, better, holier place for everyone. Sometimes when we look at the world as a whole we could easily just say what's the point, it's all away to hell anyway, but no, the day we give up is the day we lose our faith deep inside. Everyone has their part to play and we all need to shake ourselves up every now and then, remember what God has called us to do and be, and just get on with it. Years ago Cardinal Cushing wrote, if all the sleeping people will wake up, and all the lukewarm people will fire up, and all the disgruntled people will sweeten up, and all the discouraged people will cheer up, and all the depressed people will look up, and all the estranged people will make up, and all the gossiping people will shut up, and all the dry bones will shake up, and all the true soliders will stand up, and all the Church members will pray up, and if the Saviour of all will be lifted up...then we can have the greatest renewal this world has ever known. Somewhere in that list we all fit in and if we all just shook ourselves a little what a difference it would make. The call to be a disciple goes out to you again today - it's a call to listen, learn and love - say yes to God and believe.
