# Ballyclog & Donaghenry

Parish Bulletin | Third Sunday in Easter | 18th April 2021

This week we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in our Parish when the Primary 7 students from our two Primary Schools will stand and avow the faith, be anointed with the oil of Chrism and will become adult members of the Church and our community. This final Sacrament of Initiation marks both an endpoint and a beginning point in the life of faith. Up to this point these young people have spent more time than they ever will again learning about their faith, learning the stories and teachings of Christ, learning how they apply to everyday life and hopefully growing closer to God in prayer and in the things they do. And that happens not only in School but also in the home, where parents are asked to fulfil the promises they freely made when they asked to have their child baptised 11 years ago. But from the moment of Confirmation, these young people are now asked to take what they have learned and put it into practice - to think of the things of God and ask how they could make them come alive in our own little bit of the world, to look at the world itself and see where they can improve it, develop it, change it for the better, and to have the courage and confidence to stand up and do it. It's a difficult task that's set before them and before all Christians because that's what we're all asked to do. At 11 years of age they want to do all things and yet as adults we can be slow to let them even try. Is that really fair? These young people will never be able to take on or complete that task without your help, support and encouragement. This week as a community, take a little time to pray for them all, and make a promise too to give them their chance in life, to always be there for them in life, with a word of guidance, a word of thanks when they do well, a pat of encouragement when they fail, or a second chance when they're young, wild and need it most. The greatest waste in life is the talent squashed and the enthusiasm dampened. These young people are at that stage of life when they're ready to tackle the world, to change anything and make their mark, but it's only with your help that they will ever achieve it. Who knows what good could come about through them, and you could be the one who lets that happen. This week as we wish them all well and pray for them, let's all promise to try to be there for them too, to give them their chance, to trust them, to help them and to do everything we can so that one day we can all sit proudly and say they came from us, they did this for us and they made life better because we let them.

**REOPENING MITIGATIONS:** as part of Churches reopening for public worship strict mitigations and regulations have to be kept in place in accord with Government guidance.

- 1 Masks (face coverings) must be worn at all times in Churches this is non optional
- 2 Maximum capacity (175 Holy Family & 50 St Mary's) cannot be exceeded.
- 3 Contact details must be left and will be destroyed after a safe 3 week period.

#### 4 Social distance must be kept at all times

These are all regulations beyond our control but which will facilitate gathering again for Mass. They are only there to keep everyone safe and comfortable and to help avoid an increase in transmission. Thank you for your co-operation and <u>please feel free to challenge anyone whom you feel is not working inside these regulations.</u>

WHY WEAR A MASK? we have all come to know and expect that a very small number of Parishioners seem to have some issue wearing a mask/face covering/visor in Church. Unfortunately this is a direct regulation from the Government that face coverings must be worn at all times. Not only does this protect you but it also protects others and ensures their comfort to return to the Church for Worship. None of us paricularly like wearing them, but if they prevent us from becoming seriously ill, it is a small price to pay. Equally if our wearing a mask helps to save someone else from becoming seriously ill, then that is a heavy weight removed from our consciences, as I'm sure no one would ever like to think that their carelessness or stubborness was the cause of the suffering of any fellow Parishioner. If you cannot wear a mask for a genuine medical reason, YOU MUST WEAR A VISOR. If you are unable to wear either for serious medical reasons then with such a poor state of health it would be wiser to delay your return to Church or any public gathering until all risks are finally removed from society. On a final thought - we have sadly buried 18 Parishioners who were effected by Covid - please don't let your actions lead to a 19th!!

**FUNERALS & WEDDINGS** are now limited to a maximum attendance depending on the capacity of each Church. Our capacites are: Holy Family Church - 175 people; St Mary's Church, Stewartstown: 60 people; St Mary & St Joseph's Church, Bracakaville - 70 people, **CONFIRMATION** will be celebrated this week for Primate Dixon PS on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings at 5.00pm, and for St Mary's PS on Friday evening at 5.30pm, with each child to be confirmed inviting 5 guests to accompany them. Best wishes to all Confirmandi in their final preparations.

**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION** will be celebrated for the children of Primate Dixon PS on Tuesday 4th, Wednesday 5th and Thursday 6th May at 1pm, and for St Mary's Ps on Saturday 22nd May at 11.00am. First Confessions will be held in School, before these dates.
