PH-Ireland Church Gate Collection Sunday 20th June – We all know the devastation Covid-19 has wreaked throughout the world, and while we may suffer from being deprived of our treats and meets, some of the poorest parts of the world simply cannot cope with the surge in illness allied with the poor health care systems they labour under and the financial cost of trying to provide the most basic medical care. We all remember that in 2010 Haiti was devastated by its most horrific natural disaster when it was ravaged by earthquakes that saw over 200,000 deaths and 3 million people losing their homes and livelihoods. Now Haiti suffers again with the Covid pandemic filling hospitals that can barely cope as it is. While we may take so much for granted, these people sadly cannot. For every good soul who works to help them, sadly there is an equal busy person who sees their suffering as an opportunity to take advantage and make financial gain – only now those few pounds creamed off these people is at the very cost of lives. Suppliers have increased the cost of supplying oxygen tanks in Haiti to over twice their normal price and health care providers simply cannot afford the medical means they need. The result is horrific – people of all ages literally gasping their way to death with no help available. In the past local volunteers from our Parish have travelled to Haiti to offer help in their suffering, and those same volunteers are calling on your help to try to make some little difference for these people once again. Mr Philip Donnelly will hold a Church Gate Collection after Masses next weekend (19th & 20th June) in an effort to raise funds to supply oxygen tanks and medical necessities for the people of Haiti, and his efforts are joined by countless others around the world who will hopefully make some impact. We all know that we alone cannot save everyone who suffers or will die in Haiti, but if we as a Parish could save one or two or even a dozen lives, what a testament that would be to our faith and our decency. I know that these are difficult financial times for so many, but if you have anything at all to spare, this charity will genuinely save lives and forward every penny to the purchase of essential supplies. We may not hear of Haiti on the news, but we all know that in a fickle world the simple suffering can often be overlooked in favour of the glamorous headline, but the simple kindness of a few will write a headline far better than anything on screen or print - it'll be the headlines of a life saved due only to the charity, care and kindness of others. Please try to support this collection as best you can, and as a Parish we unite our prayers this week with this suffering nation, praying that their pains may soon ease and that as many may return to safety and a happy life as soon as can be.

**PRE-NUPTIAL ENQUIRY FORMS:** All couples who plan to marry this year (2021) are asked to contact the Parish office by email over the coming weeks to arrange for the completion of Pre-Nuptial Enquiry forms prior to the celebration of their marriage. This is a simple process but a necessary requirement for valid and legal celebrations. All paperwork must be completed 3 months before the wedding takes place.

BLESSING OF GRAVES 2021: At this stage of the year we would normally be preparing for the annual blessing of graves in the Parish, which are events that gather a very large attendance. Conscious of the limits that are still in place regarding the gathering of crowds and the requirements on social distancing, it has been decided to not have a public service for the blessing of the graves in 2021. Graves will be blessed privately and individually at the end of June and Mass will be offered for all who are buried in our graveyards. This decision, while sad, has been made only with the best interests for the health and safety of everyone in mind.

**GRAVE SURROUNDS:** The dimensions for all grave surrounds in our Parish are 6ft 8in wide by 8ft long, and our graveyards have now been measured to enable the best use of space available. If you need any help in marking graves please contact the Parish office by email, or our gravedigger or sacristans who will be able to assist with any concerns.

**GRAVEYARD THEFTS & CHURCH DAMAGE:** Please be aware that wreathes were removed/stolen from a grave in Brackaville on 2 occassions recently and minor damage was effected around Holy family Church. The Police have been alerted and CCTV footage consulted and a full investigation will be carried out. Please keep an eye to anything suspicious, but while being vigilant please also be careful and sensible.
