Tt was one of the most gripping news stories of 2003, and if you missed the news you probably heard the story anyway in the film'127 Hours'. In the beautiful but desolate mountains of southeastern Utah, a twenty-seven-year-old mountain climber named Aron Ralston, made a desperate decision. A keen outdoors man, Aron was rock-climbing one day when his right arm became trapped under a boulder, a boulder that was said to weigh at least eight stone. He knew starightaway that he was in big trouble. No matter how he wriggled or squirmed he couldnt free himself and so Aron took out his pocketknife and chipped away at the rock for 10 hours, but after all that effort all he managed to produce was a small handful of dust. Obviously, this was not going to work. Days were passing. No one knew where he was. Even worse, his family and friends were used to his going off for days without contacting anyone, so they weren't even looking for him. With his arm still wedged beneath this enormous boulder Aron Ralston recorded a video message to his parents telling them how much they emant to him and sayin good-bye. At the end of several days with no food or water - 127 hours - he knew he was left with only one choice. The only thing left to do was to amputate his arm in order to save himself. And that's exactly what he did, using that same pocketknife. It was an amazing display of courage and determination, a desperate man desperate to save himself if he could and willing to make the sacrifice needed if he wanted to save his life! After he was finished, with his one good arm he tied a tourniquet to the other and abseiled nearly 70 feet to the floor of the canyon. Then he hiked five miles downstream where he finally met some other hikers and was rescued. Ralston made the obviously horrible decision to amputate his right arm to save his life. It is an amazing story and a true one! Who can read this story without thinking of Jesus' words from our Gospel today, "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life maimed than with two hands to go into hell"? Christ doesn't hold back! Aron Ralston certainly made that choice - to sacrifice his arm in order to save his life. The determination and the simple desire to live were enough to give him the courage he needed when he needed and he did save his life. Life here is one thing but life in heaven is even greater, and we all want to save our lives up there. Everything that causes us to sin, everytime we let temptation win, its like trapping our spiritual lives under that boulder, and its so hard to escape. Sin becomes habit and the habit becomes indifference and then we don't care any more. Today is the right day to cut out whatever leads us to sin and free ourselves of our habits and our demons and live as best we can. Courage is all it takes, a decison to act now to save ourselves forever. There are choices that must be made in life, and those choices determine our destiny.
