and raised in the air to die at the top of a hill. When Sunday came, the tree came to realize that it was strong enough to stand at the top of the hill and be as close to God as was possible, because Christ had been crucified on it. The moral of the story is very simple, so many of our dreams and ambitions are about making only ourselves happy, and yet the dream of greatness can be a very empty one. Sometimes the greatest things happen in the simplest way. Sometimes the humble, forgettable almost unnoticeable act is the one that changes lives. Sometimes the person who doesn't live for their own glory, wealth, advance or fame is the one who is most remembered because they live serving God in the way He wants rather than themselves in the way they want. Anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant...and slave to all. Today's Gospel lays down a big challenge to us all, but it's a path that leads to a happiness that lasts for eternity rather than just the here and now. Christian humility asks only that we live for the good of God, the world and others, not just for our own dreams. There's a lot of wisdom in that if we think about it honestly. Dreams are for dreaming, but lives are for living, and its lives not dreams that change the world. The simple, humble, basic things you do could be the greatest things ever done for someone else.
