very Holy Week priests from across the Diocese gather to celebrate the Chrism Mass in the Cathedral at which the Holy Oils to be used through the year in the Sacraments are blessed and also to renew their commitment to their priesthood. It's a sad fact that every year the number who gather gets slightly smaller and the hair on the heads of those who are there gets ever whiter or ever less. When I was ordained in 2001 there were over 170 priests in the Diocese now there are sadly only somewhere in the mid 70s below the retirement age of 75 to minister to all 61 Parishes. We all know we need to pray for vocations to the priesthood if we want to have a priest in our Parish in the future. But why would we want one? Most days we don't think much about our priest, and that's not a bad thing because it means our life is going quite well and we have no urgent need of the man in black (and truth be told he never minds a quiet day). But inevitably every family and every person needs the priest at various times. For all the great family events we always seem to turn to him – at Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmations, weddings, confessions, sickness and death. We turn for daily Mass and anniversaries or prayers or when we need a confidential chat and an impartial opinion. When we need our forms filled and dead remembered. When we need a word of comfort or a word of encouragement. What he does he doesn't do for glory or praise, he does it because it is his vocation, his call from God and he acts in persona Christi. In practical terms he runs the Parish as his sworn duty, pays the bills, manages the buildings, keeps the light and heat running, keeps the accountants at bay and tries to steer a steady ship. He's far from a hero though, he's an ordinary man trying his best to be there and to give his best like we all do. But like a thread, he can be stretched so far before there's a snap, and suddenly the happy equilibrium is broken and we realise that we do need him after all. Vocations to the priesthood only come as the result of prayer and encouragement and this weekend on Vocations Sunday we're all asked to pray for those vocations to grow in number. In our own parish we know the reality of a huge reduction in the number of clergy. In the Diocese we are at the point where if one man takes ill there really is nobody to replace him. This year is a year of prayer for vocations – please join in that prayer and encourage those who may be called to this life to try, because not only can they make a huge difference, it can be the happiest life imaginable for the happy priest. For the happy priest life isn't lonely because its filled with a whole community that you share so many days with. It leads you to some of the finest people you will ever meet, gives you some of the most humbling moments in life as you see the goodness of others, some of the most grace filled moments of life as you try to make a difference. You may be hurt sometimes by the harsh word or the quick judgement of some, but the good, special, joyous moments will always outweigh those. If you're thinking of priesthood - don't be afraid - try. This weekend join in prayer for vocations, pray for your priests too that God will help and strengthen them. And pray for each other that we might all find our way to serve God in our Parish too. The Church, the faith will always survive but do your bit to make that happen.
