
For those Parishioners who wish to talk or consult. I will always be available a half hour before and after Mass in any of our Churches.

verything flourishes in it's proper place but take it away from it's norm and it rarely does well. From the greatest to the least we're all the same - we have the natural state we were made for and all the other things we try in life just don't suit us as well or make us as happy as we could be. Take a fish and place him on a beach and within seconds his gills gasp and his scales dry. Is he happy? No! So how do you make him happy? Do you cover him with a mountain of cash? Do you get him a beach chair and sunglasses? Do you bring him an iPhone and a whisky? Do you wardrobe him in double-breasted fins and people-skinned shoes? No - that we be a nonsense and a waste of time. To make him happy you simply pick him up and put him back in his element, put him back in the water that is his natural home and his natural state. He will never be happy on the beach because he was not made for the beach. Now if that's true for a fish, you can rest assured it's true for us too. We were all made by God and being made by God we all have a spark of the Divine inside us, a link to God that is our natural state. Sometimes in life, in the pursuit of what we think will make us happy or successful, we stretch that link as thin as we can and throw our energies and efforts into 101 things we think will make us more happy, important or content in life. We can pursue endless wealth or great prestige, we can chase what we think will give us fame and glory, we can trample over others to feel superior and better, we can turn to the temporary pleasures of alcohol or drugs, of consumerism to fill what we think is a gap that the rest of the world doesn't' have.
