

love you can be the hardest words to say and yet they are the most beautiful words to share or to hear. They're the words that change lives. An adult education teacher once gave his students an assignment to go to someone they ■ loved before the following week's class and tell that person that they loved them and then they would give their report of what happened at the next class. It had to be someone to whom they had never said those words before, or at least not for a very long time. At the next class, one man stood up and told his story to the class. "I was very angry with you last week when you gave us this assignment. I couldn't understand how you dared to tell us to do something so personal. But as I was driving home, my conscience started talking to me. It was telling me that I knew exactly who I needed to say 'I love you' to. Five years ago, my father and I had an awful argument which we'd never resolved. We'd avoided seeing each other since, unless it was absolutely necessary, and even then we hardly spoke to each other. He was the one I had to say it too. So last week by the time I'd returned home after class, I'd convinced myself to tell my father that I loved him. It was strange, but just making the decision seemed to lift a heavy load off my chest. When I told my wife, she jumped out of bed, gave me a big hug and for the first time in our married life, she saw me cry. We sat up half of the night talking and drinking coffee. The next day I was up bright and early as if I'd slept soundly all night. I got to the office and got more done in a couple of hours than I had the whole day before. At 9AM, I called my father to tell him I wanted to come over after work and talk to him. He reluctantly agreed. By 5:30, I was at the house. When my father answered the door, I didn't waste any time. I took one step inside and blurted out 'Dad, I just came over to tell you that I love you.' Well, it was as if a transformation had come over him. Before my eyes, his face softened, the wrinkles seemed to disappear and he too began to cry. He reached out and hugged me, saying 'I love you too, son, but I've never been able to say it.' My mother walked by just then with tears of joy in her eyes. I didn't stay long, but I hadn't felt that great in a long time. Two days after my visit, my dad, who had had heart problems but hadn't told us, had an attack and ended up unconscious in the hospital. He didn't make it. So my message to all of you in this class is: don't wait to do the things you know need to be done. If I had waited, I might never have had another chance to do what I did." Today's Gospel tells us "Love one another as I have loved you". Love isn't sitting thinking happy thoughts, it's saying and doing something that counts. Chances like people, come and go. Don't miss your chance to speak, to live and to show the love that counts. God is love, and it's only love and God Himself that changes the world.
