# Ballyclog & Donaghenry Parish Bulletin Palm Sunday 13th April 2025

'e've all been in that horrid position of having to pick a side in a dispute, an argument or just a silly row that's going on. Most times it doesn't really make that much difference to us, especially if it's all between people we don't know that well, but when it's family it's a different thing – we hear both sides, we don't want to get involved, we want to keep everybody sweet and even though we know the honourable thing is to side with what is right, deep down we're afraid to nail our colours to the mast for fear of the consequences. There's something of that in Holy Week, both gone and present. In that first Holy week Christ entered triumphal into Jerusalem adored and worshipped by the crowd, but the naysayers and unbelievers had had enough. On Wednesday He was sold out for a few pieces of silver, on Thursday He was betrayed and on Friday He died. Being God He knew what was happening and refused to be put off His mission of love, service and sacrifice that would lead to our redemption and despite His fears and tremblings as a man, He took the time to give us the Eucharist at the Last Supper and to show us the glory of service when He washed the disciples feet, casting off all notions of self-importance and uppityness for all who would follow his path. He showed us the glory of suffering and sacrifice when He died on the cross out of love for all people of all ages. And it all made sense on Easter morning when He rose from the dead. Some believed and stayed with Him right to the end, some wandered away for fear of their own skins, and some chose to go against Him to be popular even though He was right. And the saddest of all – some just didn't even care. It's easy to look at the people of the past and find their faults in that story, but sometimes we have to look to ourselves too. Holy Week is 7 days long but the lessons of Holy Week, like the gift of Holy Week lasts a lifetime and forever. How do we measure up in terms of our loyalty to Christ – do we worship well and do we try to live our faith too? Do we stand for fairness, for forgiveness, for mercy, for acceptance and for love? Sometimes we all do but sometimes we all step back and shy away from our faith and what it asks us. Sometimes we lie low and don't speak up or speak out, don't lift a hand to help or open our mouths to defend. It's like the old position of having to pick a side – it's never easy but we know deep down we should do the honourable thing and nail our colours up. There's things in life you have to pick a side on, make a stand for and faith is one of them – and it's all or nothing. If ever we needed an example of that, it's given this week when Christ gave Himself to be nailed to the Cross despite the hate, the fear, the abandonment and the rejection. Look what it achieved for us all. Look at the Cross this week and think of all Christ did this week and remember that was all just for you. How can you repay your God for His goodness to you?

EASTER TRIDUUM: The document *Paschale Solemnitatis* from the Congregation for Divine Worship gives instruction on the celebration of the Easter Triduum throughout the world. In paragraph 94 it states for the celebration of the Easter Triduum "the faithful should come together as one and should experience a sense of ecclesial community", while paragraph 43 states "Where there are Parishes with only one priest, parishes should assemble in a principal church and participate in the celebration there". In light of this wise document and of our own parish situation the Easter ceremonies will be celebrated as follows.
