Fifth Sunday in Caster 18th CDay 2025

his weekend and last weekend we celebrated First Holy Communion in the Parish, when all our P4 students receive the Blessed Sacrament for the first time in their lives. First Communion days are always special – there's always a lot of preparation and every bow from every child has military precision, the fancy frock is bought, the first suit too, dinners booked and families gathered and the wallets are all opened up. We all make a great fuss of First Holy Communion. And on the other end of life, we all make a fuss too of the final Communion anyone receives – their Viaticum or 'food for the journey', because at the end of our days it's calming to know we walk to meet our God with the Body of Christ inside us as our strength and our guide. When we say farewell knowing that someone has received those final Sacraments we have a little peace despite the sorrow. I suppose the inevitable question arises then – what's different about those two key moments than any other time we receive Holy Communion? The answer is – nothing. Every time we receive Communion we come closer to God than at any other time of our day or our lives. God enters our bodies and, if we allow Him, changes us – but only if we allow. That may sound strange, but the truth is God doesn't force Himself or His ways on any of us, it's something we choose for ourselves and for God to change us, the way we act or behave, our attitudes and our dispositions, we have to choose to let that happen too. The only way to choose is to stop and think about what we believe and what we receive. In every Mass Christ is sacrificed on the altar once more – giving His Body out of love for you. When we really think about that it should make us see every opportunity to be at Mass, to be in the presence of God, to receive Holy Communion as the greatest privilege of our lives. If we really believe in Christ and really believe in what happens on the Altar, if we really believe in the love of God for every one of us – we would cry for joy at how lucky we are, how blessed we are to have such a God as ours. It never does us any harm to review our own faith honestly, to review our Mass and our ways. In the presence of God we should be respectful, we should be prayerful and dignified. We're always that way for other important people and events – all the more reason to be the same for God. If God Himself walked into our rooms we would be models of perfection in our words and ways. God walks right into our lives in every Mass – always be the same. We make such fuss for the first and last Communion, why not make the same fuss for every Communion? This month of May, why not set some time aside to think about what we are offered at every Mass, at every devotions and at every visit to Church. We're offered the chance to be in the Real Presence of God, to receive the real Body of Christ, to worship the very presence of God. Don't waste that chance. Stop, think, believe and respond.
