here's always a little hidden nugget somewhere in the scriptures on a Sunday, a little line that we can pass over quickly to get to the punchline for the weekend, and the Gospel today is no different. That little line early on "If anyone loves me he will keep my word" (John 14:23) is a challenge to us all as we try to practice our faith daily, because it reminds us as to why we should practice that faith freely and easily, and why we should want to do the things of God in life - not because we have to, but because we want to, because we want to show our love for God. There is a story about a man who saw an angel walking down the street. The angel was carrying a torch in one hand and a bucket of water in the other. "What are you going to do with that torch and that water?" the man asked. The angel looked at him and said, "With this torch, I am going to burn down the mansions of Heaven; and with the bucket of water, I am going to put out the fires of Hell. Then we're going to see who really loves God." The angel's point was that many people obey God's commandments out of fear of punishment in Hell or hope of reward in Heaven. They don't obey God for the reason Jesus gives in today's Gospel. Jesus said, "If you love me you will obey my commandments" (John 14:15). It's always good to do a good thing, a kindly or loving deed – the physical performance of faith, but often we can do it to look good or be praised or recognized for our brilliance or maybe even just so that someone else won't talk about us. But in our home we're somehow different - when we do something for family and loved ones we do it because we can and want to, we want to make them happy, make them proud and make them feel loved and we spare no energy or time to make that happen. Today we're asked to give God that same free and generous love. The selfless act is a wonderful thing - to do something good just because it's a good thing. To be kind because you can and want to. To be loving because love is free. Never be afraid to show you love God by the way you live. Some people might not understand you for doing it, some might just think you're mad and that you should only ever act if there's a good pay off - don't listen to them and certainly don't worry about them. A little goodness goes a long way, a little faith in the world makes a big difference, and what you do might just be the thing that makes someone rediscover happiness, hope, courage or peace in life and that is where we see the hand of God reach out from you and lift others up. If anyone love me he will keep my word - the word of God is love, go out and show your love of God by your love to each other.
