here we go hereafter depends on what we go after, here – wise old words that are very appropriate for today's Gospel. The tale of Lazarus and Dives is the story of a rich man who had it all and a poor man who had nothing, neither were bad people and neither knowingly did any harm, and both died. The poor man went to heaven, the rich man to hell. How can that be fair you might ask – simple – while the rich man did no wrong he also did nothing, he forgot to share his blessings with those who needed them most. He was guilty of not bothering, guilty of the sin of omission. The sin of omission might seem like an old-fashioned concept to so many, but it is a key part of our faith – that God has blessed us all with many gifts, talents, fortunes of one type or another and He has entrusted us with a duty to use them wisely. The sin of omission is when we just don't bother – don't bother to help, to care, to cheer, to respect, to welcome or to love. In the busy run of life it's very easy to forget that duty. We all get caught up with so many things we think are so important and we believe must be done right now, and in the frantic run of life the easiest thing to forget is the little thing – the charitable hand, the smile to a sad face, the minute or two to stop and chat and give someone a little respect and dignity. Some day we know the busyness will slow up for us all and one day it will stop and then like Dives, the rich man in the Gospel, we'll go off to meet our God. For all that we might gather in this life, for all that we might fill our time with, God will be most interested in how we took the time to care, to live our faith in good works. In truth none of us will be able to say we were too busy or too important to care for others, because God will know what we really did with all our time and our blessings and will rank us accordingly. Luckily for us, we always have time to turn it all around and make a difference still and everyone can. Helping people isn't all about throwing cash at them, some things make more difference than money welcoming people when we see them, having time for them when they're lonely, sad or afraid, encouraging them when they doubt, respecting them when no one else will, forgiving them when they mess up, helping them when we can, pulling them through to tomorrow when today has been the hardest day of their lives. It takes so little time and effort to do those things that actually count and yet without them how horrible would the world be? Life is lived once and yet the opportunities to do good, to do our duty for God and others come hundreds of times a day. Don't waste life living it only for you and for what you can get, live it wisely by remembering that any tiny thing you give, say or do can make someone else's life better. Don't forget to chase a happy world rather than just a happy you, because where we go hereafter depends on what we go after, on what we chase here
