his weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, the final Sunday in the Church's year, and the Gospel we listen brings us back to the moment that the love of God that we prepared for in Advent, that we celebrated being born at Christmas, that we heard being shown in miracles and kindnesses throughout the year, was made perfect when He died on the cross out of love for the world. Christ's is an odd kingship by today's standards because He has so much competition in the modern world, so many things that compete for the adoration of people - money, fashion, food, fame, popularity and acceptance. In truth we all buy into at least one of them. And yet the Kingship of Christ is different – it reminds us of what really counts in the world – honesty, integrity, a heart that cares for others. Modern fads come and go and we can all jump on the band wagon of the popular just to fit in and be accepted. But every now and then some lone voice will step out and say or do the thing that gives us all a little jolt. Think of the two thieves in the Gospel - one hung dying and still wanted to be popular and gave him up his last chance to do the right thing by joining the crowd that mocked the crucified Christ. He was a fool rather than a hero. The other could have done the same but instead, even though he was on the way out too, said a kind word to Christ, saw Him for what He was and whispered the words "remember me when you come into your kingdom". He was the brave one – He didn't say what the crowd wanted, he didn't join in to fit in, he did what was noble, decent and loving and he did it out of his own free choice. That is the faith Christ wants from us all – to love him because we want to, to be Christian because we choose it as the only way to live, to be kind for kindness sake, to be loving for the glory love, to stand by our convictions, our morals and follow the example of Christ that we hear every weekend and every day. It might take us a whole lifetime to be brave enough to do it, but what a world it would be if we all tried. One of the most famed Kings in history was Henry VIII and in the Royal Court, Cardinal Hugh Latimer often used to preach before him. It was usual for the Court preacher to give the king something on his birthday, and Cardinal Latimer presented Henry VIII with a pocket handkerchief with this text in the corner -'Seducers and adulterers God will judge'; a very suitable text for King Henry. Then he stood and preached on the sins of lust, and didn't forget to apply it to the King. Furious, Henry said that the next Sunday when the Cardinal preached, he must publicly apologize. The next Sunday, when the Cardinal stood in the pulpit, he thought to himself, "Latimer, be careful about what you say, the King of England is here." At the same time a voice in his heart said, "Latimer, Latimer, be careful about what you say, the King of Kings is here." Bravely he preached only what God wanted him to preach. In everything we say and do, remember those same words – the King of Kings is here. Do and say only what is right.
