First Sunday in Advent - 30th November 2025

// very day of our life, whether it's the best or the worst, lasts only 24 hours and no matter what that day holds, no matter how much we look forward to it or dread it, in a very quick blink that day will be added to the great bank of our memories. But probably no other day of the year gets a heavier share of preparation and a bigger measure of expectancy than Christmas Day. These days the TV is filled with Christmas adverts for food, toys, treats and who knows what else, and to entice us that little bit more we have the great Black Friday offers – never have so many deals for things we don't' need been received!! No matter who we are we all buy into the idea of trying to make that extra effort for Christmas doing something to make it special. As a day of gift ripping and turkey shredding, Christmas does only last a day – another 24 hours, but as a spiritual season, as a Christian time, Christmas should last so much longer. Just like we prepare for the temporal side of Christmas, as people of faith we're asked to prepare for the spiritual dimension of Christmas, the root of the Feast for us who believe. Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent and this marks the start of our preparations for Christmas. In every Church building the countdown to Christmas Day is marked by the lighting of the Advent wreath – 4 candles – one for each Sunday – and those 4 candles represent the 4 things we're asked to reintroduce to the world in preparation for Christmas and to try in some small way to help Christmas make the world better for the next 365 days. The four lights represent hope, peace, love and joy, four great virtues that can transform any life or any day. Hope is that belief that life will always get better, difficulties will diminish and happiness will grow – who do you know that needs hope this year and where do you need hope in life yourself? Can you do anything about it? Peace is the freedom to be ourselves in the world and with other people, the freedom to have our wrongs forgotten and be given a second chance. Is there someone in your life who you can give that gift of peace to? We all have someone who fits in there and in truth we all need that gift of peace and forgiveness from others ourselves too. Don't wait – just do it. Love is the gift of being accepted and of being seen as someone special in the eyes of someone else. Love sees beyond the darkness of our lives and always sees the little bit of light, goodness and grace. Who needs to know that you love them? Put them together and we can all find joy this Advent and Christmas. In a world that can sometimes be a tad grim and gloomy, Christmas comes as a little nugget of happiness – but for happiness to last and make a difference it takes work from us all. With a little effort to put some hope, peace, love and joy into every day, not just 24 hours the spirit of Christmas can last forever. This year – give it a go in a way that counts and to the people that count or need it most.
