


Prayer to be a Kinder Christian

Dedication of the Lateran Basilica – 9th November 2025

t's not too often that we celebrate the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica on a Sunday because very few Feasts throughout the year replace the normal Sunday Mass, but this one is set higher than most as it marks the anniversary of the Cathedral Church of Rome in 324AD by Pope Sylvester I, that Church which is the Mother Church of Rome and of the world, and the Pope's Cathedral. It's a reminder to us all of the universality of the Church, that even though we might look at the same faces and listen to the same voice every weekend we are part of something so much bigger – part of a faith that has travelled the world to every continent and has over 1.5 billion followers. It's easy to collapse our faith into our little local environ and to fill our minds with the tiny gripes we might have – that stubborn pothole, that annoying light, that ugly statue, that person we don't like, and in the midst of the noise that creates in our minds we lose sight of the purpose of our faith – to come to know the God who loves everyone equally, who died for everyone not just a few, who in the life of His Son gave us a path to build heaven on earth if only we would look and listen. In the Gospel Christ loses it a bit, gets out the whip and clears the Temple to make it a place of worship again, a place where we think only of God in the right way. And there's a great gentle lesson for us all in that. In Church do we really step out of the world to be with God or do we come to fill the Church with the things of the world – hardness of heart, an unforgiving eye, a critical smirk or a mentality that we're doing God the favour by being here rather than realise it's God blessing us by letting us step into his peace for a few moments to gain the strength to keep on living and loving in a world that so badly needs a little good. How often do we let our minds wander far away in Church – do we pray or do we gawk? Do we worship or do we quietly judge? Do we genuinely ask God for His help and grace, or do we try to bargain our way with God to a better life? Sometimes it doesn't hurt to get the whip out in our own minds too and to chase the things of the world for a little while to rediscover the hope our faith gives us. Our faith reminds us constantly that with God in our lives no matter how bad today may be tomorrow can be better, and it's you and I who are the instruments God uses to make that happen until the day we're all taken to the perfect world of Heaven. For the 38 minutes you're at Mass every weekend, forget the daily world if you can – don't let the prejudices, the opinions or the complaints take over what is a time when you can just sit quietly with your God. Remember that the local worries of the Parish are just little itches on the great Body that is the Universal Church. Be proud of your part in something that fills the world with hope. Step up and do your part to bring hope or love or blessings to the world in your life. Shut the small eyes that can look, see and revel in the faults of local life and focus only on God, on giving praise to God, on trusting God's ways not the worlds and trying to really be part of a worldwide faith built on love, building love and building heaven on earth today.
