Third Sunday in Advent - 14th December 2025

▼/ audete Sunday is the traditional name for this Third Sunday of Advent, based on the opening antiphon of the Mass "Gaudete in Domino semper" – rejoice always in the Lord, and it's a refreshing thought to think that this is a day specifically set aside to just be happy and to remind ourselves to always look for a reason to be happy. The second reading tells us just that – "Be happy at all times". Sometimes I think people are determined to convince us that the world is a fiercely gloomy place – there are some unfortunate souls who have an almost freakish talent for spotting what is wrong, or spotting a fault or mistake, or just seeing the downsides of everything. More fool us if we listen to them too long because they'll inevitably drag us down. Sometimes though we meet people who always seem to raise a smile or say and do just enough to make us think life is good, the world is nice, people are decent and that with them beside us we can do all things ourselves. It's a stark difference between the two types and yet we all know which ones we like to be with. This Sunday is God's reminder to us all to try to be that joyful and happy person when and where we can. And truth be told we all have some reason to be happy in life. We're all blessed in some way – with family or friends who just make life good, with memories that can cheer us all up, with a little comfort to brighten the darker days, with peace, food, warmth the good things that make life well. We're all surrounded by people who work hard to try to make things as good as they can - charitable people, caring people, people who quietly do the little things that make everything come together. If we look - there's always a reason to be happy and joyful in life, always a reason to be thankful. Today why not spend a minute or two thinking of what your blessings are, and if there's someone who makes life good – let them know! If you're one of the poor sorts that too often sees the gloom or the negative, why not for one day deliberately chase the morbid thoughts and look instead to the good in your life and in other people. We all know that none of us is perfect, but I genuinely believe that we're all far more good than we're ever bad, and the world is actually filled with infinitely more good people, works and acts than we ever recognise. It's odd what a little positivity can do – it shakes the gloom away, it helps us just appreciate all we have rather than sit moaning and mumbling about what we don't have, it encourages other people to smile more widely, to strive to be ever better and in that it makes the world we live in so much better for everyone. "Be happy at all times" isn't bad advice, and Gaudete or Rejoicing Sunday isn't a bad thing either. For the last week of Advent, give it a go - shush the sharpness and let the happiness come out, quiet the negative and let the positive take over for a while. Smile and grateful for who you are, who you have and what you have, be appreciative of what others do and help other people find happiness by bringing a little happiness to their life when you can. Rejoice and give thanks because God has blessed you.
