On 11th February, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, which is also marked annually as the World Day of the Sick, when we're asked to pray in a particular way for all the sick we know, the sick who have no one to pray for them and especially for all those who work to help the sick wherever they may be. Every year seems to strike every area with a vast amount of sickness, either in body or in mind, and it always effects so many people in different ways. Obviously, those who suffer directly from illness need our prayers so much as we ask God to give them healing and return them to happiness in life. But their families and friends also carry a huge burden as they try to keep strength for their loved ones, try to give a bit of hope and normality mixed with care and comfort, and sometimes we forget that they need our prayers just as much. In all those situations we know that a kindness and a helping hand makes such a difference, but it's good to remember that a little prayer can go a long way too. A prayer is such a simple thing – words quickly uttered – but the motivation for every prayer is always special because every prayer wishes kindness and good on ourselves or others. Because of that our prayers are such a source of strength to anyone in need. We mightn't think that prayer solves much, but for those on the receiving end of them, the knowledge that someone else cares enough to think of them, to remember them and to wish them only well can be a great source of strength and can give the hope and courage to fight on the great battles of life. Never tire saying a prayer for them all because while your prayer may not bring about a major miracle, who knows what graces those prayers may still bring to someone living through a dark day. Put on the news and you regularly see the difficulties doctors and nurses work in these days, too often the butt of ridicule and judgement, the victim of rudeness, aggression and misdirected anger. But where would we be without them and the sacrifices they make for us? Do they get everything right? Of course not, but none of us do, yet they keep on trying to give and do their best in the hardest of arenas. Every year those who nurse and tend to the sick do a wonderful job that goes mostly unnoticed. We see and hear of those times when the health service struggles, when carers struggle too and when families feel totally overwhelmed, but their work goes on regardless and we don't remember enough that they simply don't stop giving people not just care but kindness and a smile to cheer the gloom. Each of those who work with the sick in any way, show in their efforts the face of Christ to the world – the face that stays there with us no matter what our struggle, the tear that drips when no more can be done, and the smile that says you will be well again so go and live well. This World Day of the Sick let's try to add to that hope by our prayers and good thoughts, let the sick know we remember and let those who care for the sick know we appreciate them. Sickness will always be in the world, but where good people walk the suffering of the sick can always be given comfort, dignity and respect. Maybe our prayer this year should be help them all O God and thank you for them too.
